This year's fishing trip will take place on The L'Escalier Reservoir in Bowman, Quebec

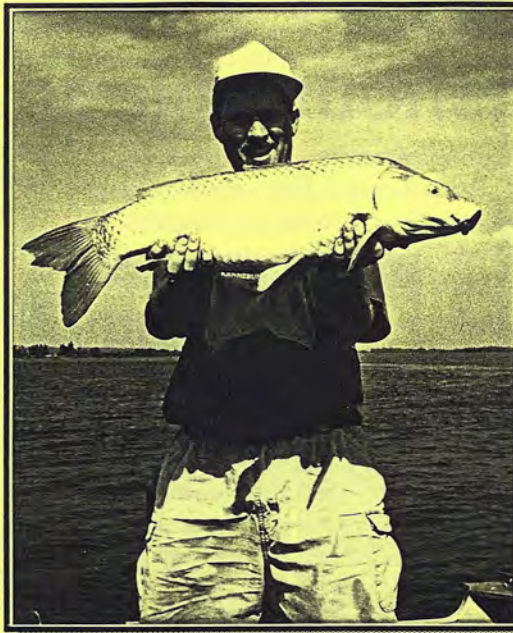
## A New Fishing Hole: Dreams of the Big One

Will this year's annual fishing trip be the year of the big fish? Could it be a giant largemouth bass or that monster northern pike we all dream about? Could this be the year we've all been waiting for? A fishing trip that we will be talking about for years to come?

The 1999 fishing trip will take place on the Father's Day week-end, Friday, June 18 to Tuesday, June 22, 1999. This year's event will take place at the **Pourvoirie Riviere La Lievre** on the L'Escalier Reservoir in Bowman, Quebec.

The Pourvoirie Riviere La Lievre is situated near Val-des-Bois on route 307, about 70 kilometers north of Ottawa.

Ronald Zinn, last year's winner, is in charge of organizing this year's trip. Last week he said that everything is falling in to place perfectly, "I contacted most of the

guys who have been on the trip in recent years and everyone was in agreement that the trip should be held on the father's day week-end."

Zinn, who caught a 15 pound carp last June to win the trophy started out by checking *Le Guide des Pourvoiries du Quebec* and contacted a few places in and around the Ottawa area, but found nothing. He then asked

friends and people around the office and came up with the **Pourvoirie Riviere La Lievre**. This place was highly recommended by Ray Coney, a friend of Ron's from Lachute.

The place is run by Pierre and Louise Labonte. It has seven cabins of different sizes to accommodate groups from 2 to 15, plus a main lodge and dining room, which is fully licensed.

The cabin rented for the fishing trip is for 10 people. It is equipped with double beds and has a fully functional kitchen and bathroom.

In the main lodge, you can relax with a beer and meals are served with reservations only.

Fishing on the Lievre River and the L'Escalier Reservoir is apparently excellent. Types of fish include dore, northern pike, bass and trout. According to the manager of the Pourvoirie Riviere La Lievre, the fish are abundant and there are many large ones. We will all know if this is true by the end of June.

Reserve your spot for the fishing trip now! A deposit of \$25.00 is required by March 1, 1999. The total amount can also be paid.

# Information you need to Know

*How much will this cost me? What do I need to bring?*

So, the dates are Friday, June 18 to Tuesday, June 22, 1999. Check-in time on Friday is 5:00 p.m. Check-out time on Tuesday is anytime before 2:00 p.m.

The cost for renting the cottage is \$575.00 for 4 nights, which includes 2 chaloupes. The final cost per person will depend on how many people actually show up and how

many extra boats we need to rent. Other costs will include gas and trophy money, among other things. The final cost person should not be more than \$125.00 but could be as low as \$75.00.

The cabin has two bedrooms and has a fully equipped kitchen and bathroom, as well as a barbecue outside.

You will need to bring a sleeping bag for yourself and an air mattress if you are sensitive to other people's farts.

You will also need all the usual personal supplies such as your own towels, toiletries and food.

For people who do not like to cook, there is a restaurant on site, however, reservations are needed.

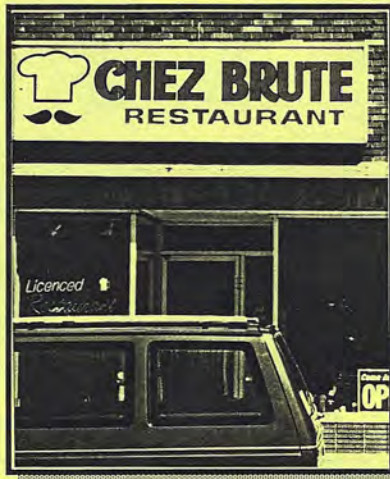

If you want to get a head start on the fishing trip and head out Thursday evening, there are a few places in the Ottawa area where you can stay.

If you're nice, Curt Bowles might offer you a room at his place. His place is known as *Chez Brute*. Stick to the rules of the place and there should not be any problems. The rules include: bring your own food and drinks; don't make a mess; don't sit in Curt's chair, and prop him up if he gets too hosed. A complete list of rules will be brought to your attention when you check in.

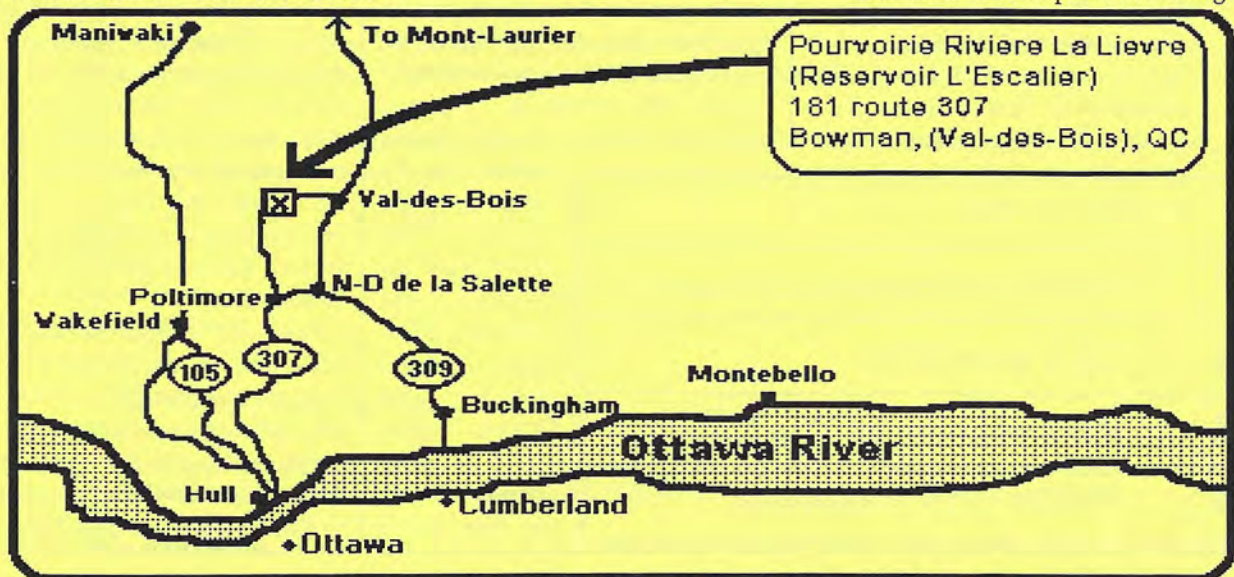
*Chez Brute* in Orleans, Ont

The rules of the house are somewhat similar to those of *Chez Brute*, plus no harry inside and keep the noise down after 11:00 p.m.

Both places offer entertainment and games of chance including poker and STQ. Both places require that you bring your own beer and beverages, but offer free hors d'ouvres and pizza at midnight.

## Questions you might Ask

**Q:** I have my own boat but I'm not sure if I want to bring it. Will I be able to rent one there?

**A:** Yes. Two chaloupes are included with the rental of our cabin, but we can rent one or two more to accommodate our needs. You may also bring your own boat if you wish. The *Pourboirie Riviere La Lievre* has a boat launch.

**Q:** I plan to go on the fishing trip, but probably only for 2 or 3 days and not for the entire trip. Do I still have to pay the full price?

**A:** Yes. You will be asked to pay a total of \$125.00 (minus your deposit) when you arrive. To save the problem of calculating what everyone owes, the easiest way is to divide the total price of the trip and divide it by the number of people who attend. The total price should not be more than \$125.00 per person, which is not very expensive for 4 nights/5 days of fishing, including boats. Depending on how many people show up on the trip, the price could be as low as \$100.00.

**Q:** I live in Ontario, but the fishing trip is in Quebec. Will I need to buy a Quebec fishing permit?

**A:** Yes. Fishermen visiting from outside the Province of Quebec need a valid Quebec fishing permit. Visitor permits are available for 1 day, 4 day, or for the season.

At press time, it was not known if permits are available at the *Pourboirie Riviere La Lievre*. It is strongly recommended that, if you can, buy your permit before you

arrive. You can call the *Pourboirie* at 819-454-2473 for information.

**Q:** I have a buddy who really wants to come on your fishing trip. Can he?

**A:** Highly Unlikely. We have booked a cabin for 10 people, but the ultimate crew would be 6 or 7 men. Our list of invitees is 10: All the regulars, plus Tony Defazio, Kevin Cross, Billy Zinn, and Ron Malloff.

If your buddy really wants to come, there are rooms available at *L'Auberge La Lievre* for \$80.00 a night. He can call 819-454-2473 for information and reservations. Make sure he brings lots of money for poker.

**A:** I have never actually been to the place, so I can't give you a real answer. When I made the reservation, I asked how the fishing was. The manager of the *Pourboirie Riviere La Lievre*, Louise Labonte said the fishing is great, "IL y a beaucoup de poissons et beaucoup des poissons larges." So, she seems quite confident that we'll catch some nice ones.

I checked out the place on the map and the *L'Escalier Reservoir*

seems quite large, almost as large as Piscatosin.
