# Fishin Trip 99 Newsletter Date Date May 1, 1999


The big rush for reservations for this years trip had to be cut off early

## The Big Week-end is booked to capacity!

If you haven't reserved your spot for the annual June fishing trip, you're too late. The annual get-away is booked to capacity and no longer accepting reservations. Good organization and careful planning for the trip helped create a fury of interest not seen in years.

Ronald Zinn, organizer of this year's trip was surprised at how many guys decided to attend, "Gee, I planned this for 5 or 6 guys like the past few years, I never expected a response like this! I was a little taken back by all interest," Zinn said.

"A few phone calls, a crappy little newsletter, and a few more phone calls and it was organized! I actually had to cut it off at 10 guys. If I had even tried, we could have

Since the cabin booked is for 10 people and 10 guys have signed up, space will be limited. Sleeping arrangements will be tight. Some people will be sleeping side by side in double beds, however there are a few single beds available. As usual, there will be draw to choose the sleeping arrangements.

Four chaloupes have been reserved, that means two guys per boat, so the fishing should be great. Will *The Canette* be coming

## The price has changed, but it's still a deal

With so many people wanting boat rentals for the this year's fishing trip, organizer Ron has had to make some price adjustments.

"Ya, we're going to ask for a few more dollars from each person, because I did not anticipate the need for boat and motor rentals." Ron said from his office in Westmount, Quebec, "I've had to reserve two more chaloupes and 4 motors."

The new price per person will probably be closer to \$150.00 than the previously announced \$125.00 per person. The price breakdown for the trip is \$500.00 plus

tax for the cabin which includes 2 chaloupes. The extra chaloupes are \$15.00 each a day, and the motors are \$35.00 a day. The price has changed, but Ron says it's still a tremendous deal.

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#### Just A Reminder

As mentioned in the previous Fishin' Trip '99 Newsletter, you must bring your own sleeping bag and pillow on the fishing trip. You must also bring all other personal supplies and food.

Don't bother bringing coffee, Costa Rican and Guatamalen drip will available free in our cabin. As usual, midnight snacks will also be served. Do you have suggestions or favorites you'd like served? #### **Quebec Licenses a Must**

Quebec fishing licenses are a must for this year's fishing trip. There is a Bureau de service de la conservation et de la faune de Quebec located in nearby Val-des-You can be sure the conservation agents will be in the area and checking up on us. I have checked with our outfitter and Quebec visitors licenses will be available for sale on our fishing trip.

#### The Dead Minnow Club

As is the case throughout most of Quebec, live minnows are not

permitted to use as bait. It is legal, however to use dead minnows, but only the minnows of white fish. It is strictly forbidden to use the minnows of pike, bass, catfish, sturgeon, walleye, muskie, trout, perch, as well as many others. 
